

Liam His name means strong-willed warrior, and he is.



As a first time Mom, Brandee was unsure as to what she was feeling.

She just knew that she wasn't feeling well.

At 24 weeks pregnant, her doctor ordered a Doppler test. The results were that Brandee's baby wasn't receiving the necessary blood flow from the umbilical cord to the placenta. She was quickly hospitalized at St. Francis Medical Center in Colorado Springs where she was on continuous monitoring.

During that time, *Brandee began experiencing a wide variety of concerning symptoms:* high blood pressure; edema; vomiting; pain in her vital organs and an inability to eat or sleep.

A blood test revealed Brandee was suffering from HELLP Syndrome, a relatively unknown syndrome that affects approximately 0.2 - 0.6 percent of all pregnancies. Medication prescribed hopes to control dangerously high blood pressure and prevent seizures. When Mom's red blood cells and platelets are compromised, a blood transfusion is required. Women with HELLP need to give birth as soon

as possible, even if the baby is born prematurely, as HELLP complications dramatically get worse, harming both mom and baby.

Because of the dire consequences, Brandee was scheduled for an emergency C-Section.

At 26 weeks gestation, Liam Ismael Valdez arrived, 14 weeks before his due date.

Weighing just 1 pound, 4 ounces, this baby boy has fought for his life each and every day of the last three months.

Ronald McDonald House Charities of Southern Colorado made sure that Liam's family was always just steps away from his bedside, allowing them to keep a close watch over both Liam and his care.

When Liam's Dad would go back to work, Liam's great grandma came and stayed with Brandee, making sure there was a continuum of care and support for both her granddaughter and great grand baby.

Brandee said, "Staying here has been such a gift. You have given me so much time with Liam."

While Liam's condition has remained fragile she added, "There's no place else I would be than by his side." She continued, "You've made a safe place. The impact of you taking time out of your lives to make sure every family's needs are taken care of... it's been life changing for me."

Liam has continued to grow. He now weighs 4 pounds, 4 ounces. While still looking at another month of being hospitalized, Brandee is feeling hopeful. "Ten days ago, they started him on a steroid to help his lungs. The eye doctor has been here and is watching closely to see if Liam will need corrective surgery. He is now off of the ventilator. After Liam is 70 more grams, he will

start on formula. Once all of that happens, *I'm ready* to take him home."

Fully prepared to be a Mom, Brandee is excited for the day when she gets the "OK" on her safe child car seat inspection check and she can buckle her boy in and leave the hospital.

"The support and comfort from other people has been so helpful. *I will never forget the blessings.* I take time now to notice all of the small things, as they truly are gifts."

Having a baby changes everything.

Capital Campaign We're so close!



Since opening our doors in 1987, Ronald McDonald House Charities of Southern Colorado has provided thousands of families a "home base" while local medical facilities care for their critically ill or injured child. After 31 years, we've outgrown our existing Ronald McDonald House® and need to expand to accommodate the growing demand for our services.

Last year, 322 families stayed at our House, coming from 2 countries, 7 states, 27 Colorado counties and beyond.



The average length of stay was 8 days. We expect those numbers to significantly rise in the next few years, when the new Children's Hospital Colorado, Colorado Springs opens their doors.

To meet the growing need, RMHCSC is building a new 25,000 square-foot House in northern Colorado Springs, that quadruples our guest room capacity, provides improved amenities to help make our families as comfortable as possible, and adds space for future expansion.

To date, our Capital Campaign has raised more than \$8 million of the \$10 million needed. Thank you for your support!
